## Eighteen KKBI Students

The Bible School opened January 5 with eighteen students. Six are from Laos—five men and one woman and twelve are Thai students—seven men and five women. We also have two audit students not pictured. This June we will graduate another five students, bringing the total to 105 Khon Kaen Bible Institute graduates.

MookDa, our youngest daughter, will also finish with the group and then she will continue her education at the Khon Kaen University International for another four years. We are happy that she chose to study the Bible before attending a secular university. It will help immune her toward worldly thinking.

Today our Bible students are more young people than adult leaders from the village churches. Also most of the students now live in town or in the city. We encourage them to attend the Bible school before they go to the university, before they meet with secular professors in the universities, and before they meet their schoolmates who are unbelievers. If they are immune with the WORD, then they will be able to face the resistance and worldly educated professors.

Ken Fox, a former missionary in Thailand, Laos, and Cambodia, helped teach 1 & 2 Thessalonians last semester and will teach Philippians this semester. Ken is a man with good qualifications and experience and is an elder at the Mesa Church in Mesa, Arizona. Both our Thai and Lao students get much from his instruction.

We will also have a short summer Bible school for the high school and university students during the middle of March until the end of May. We are expecting about five or more students for this session.

## Aftermath of Last October Camp

Ignocensia N. (Jane) Tayor, 32 years old, from Cameroon was baptized December 21 after she came back from the October 13-17, 2014, family camp.
